Wildlife Experts Say "Take More Bear"

Foggy Mountain intentionally under harvests the bear in our hunting areas, and the population has continued to increase.

The State's bear biologists estimate that the areas of Maine where we hunt have population densities well over one bear per square mile. The thriving bear population is at a record high and is still growing rapidly.

"Take More Bears"

Biologists at Maine's Fish & Wildlife Department continue their request for hunters to kill more bear. They have even been holding meetings to discuss how to achieve this goal.

Foggy Mountain knows how to help. We added many new bait sites last year and they became active this season.

Brandon anticipates that the 2021 and 2022 seasons will produce some outstanding bear.

Share Your Heritage

Take Your Father Hunting! Cress' Truly Memorable Hunt

Cress Sowry contacted us early last year, wanting to book a hunt for himself and his father, who had never taken a big game animal before.

We had great conversation and he decided to come for the first week of the 2020 bear season. Cress Jr would be using his bow and Cress Sr's weapon of choice was a rifle.

Wasn't long into the 2020 bear season, and Cress Jr arrowed his very first black bear. Cress Sr also saw a bear on his first night in the stand, but gave it a pass as it was not what he was looking to place his tag on.

On day two, Cress Jr asked if it would be ok to sit with his father for the remainder of the hunt.

Our blinds are big enough for two hunters, but we do not recommend it due the fact that it means twice the human scent and movement at the bait site.

Cress and Cress assured us they would be as careful as they could with scent control and movement.

About an hour before dark, they caught movement coming from the right of the bait. Wasn't long after and they saw movement at the bait.

Cress Sr put his crosshairs on the bear, waited for the perfect shot to line up, and then dropped a nice boar in his tracks.

Both Cress Jr and Sr harvested their bear just 24 hours apart. It is a memory that we are sure they will not forget, and likely will be talked about often!

Take Your Son Hunting! Scott & Kyle Stirn's "Double"

Scott hunted with Foggy Mountain in 2018 and harvested his very first Maine Black bear. Scott called this summer to see if he and his son Kyle could come this season. Kyle had never harvested or even seen a bear.

It was great seeing a familiar face when Scott arrived on Sunday. We got them settled in their cabin and Monday the hunt was on!

When Scott went to his stand on Monday, a bear had already hit the bait. Unfortunately, it did not show itself that evening. Monday afternoon went the same for Kyle, who also saw no bear.



Bear Activity

The 2020 season had the bait sites very active. We went through a record amount of bait due to so much activity.

While sending so many trophy bear home with hunters, our sightings tally showed that a record number of sows and cubs had been passed up on by our hunters, ensuring a great future here at Foggy Mountain.

The reason for so many sows and cubs compared to other seasons was the 2019 Natural food crop.

In 2019, every source of natural food produced a bumper crop. The abundance of food made for very healthy bear, and most sows that were able to breed, did so, and they were then able to give birth to and raise very healthy cubs.

We look forward to watching these young bear grow into trophy bear that our hunters can put a tag on in the future!

2021 Bear Hunts

Foggy Mountain's two most popular bear hunting packages are geared to suit everyone's individual needs.

Both hunts are in bear infested regions where we have hunted or performed field research for decades.

Bear hunting success is the same in both areas, only our accommodations are different:

- Lodging for our Katahdin-Highlands **Region** hunts is housekeeping style (each cabin has a full kitchen).
- Lodging for our West Branch Region hunts is American Plan (all meals are included).

Both hunts are on private lands with access controlled by gates, as are 95% of our total hunting territories.

Katahdin-Highlands Hunts

2021 Bear Hunts:

- Hunt August 30th (Arrive on the 29th) thru September 3rd;
- or hunt September 6th (Arrive on the 5th) thru September 10th.

Maine's vast Highland Region lies between our base camp, Mount Katahdin and Moosehead Lake to the north.

You will be hosted at our new base camp on Ebeemee Lake, where you can meet other hunters, share stories, and we even have wireless internet for those who "just can't get away from it all."

We offer excellent housekeeping accommodations in comfortable cottages or camps. We match your lodging to the size of your party and the area you are hunting.

We provide bedding and household equipment. You'll have everything you need to prepare your own meals inexpensively. There are also several places to eat within easy driving distance.

West Branch Hunts

2021 Bear Hunts:

- Hunt September 13th (Arrive on the 12th) thru September 17th;
- or hunt September 20th (Arrive on the 19th) thru September 24th.

This hunt is in Maine's famous West Branch Region between Moosehead Lake and the Canadian border.

This bear hunt is tailored the same as our Highlands, Katahdin & Moosehead hunts, except you will stay in the comfort of a fully restored Maine Lumberjack Lodge. The lodge is designated as an official National and Maine Historic Site, and features original turn-of-century architecture and decor.

What's more, you'll enjoy homecooked, all-you-can-eat, lumberjack-style meals, reputed to be the biggest and the best in Maine.

And the coffee pot is always on.



Spring Turkey Hunts

2021 Turkey Season:

Hunt May 3rd to May 7th, or Hunt May 10th to May 14th, or Hunt May 17th to May 21st, or Hunt May 24th to May 28th

Maine's turkey population is booming! Wild turkeys were re-introduced over twenty years ago and the population flourished thanks to the excellent habitat provided by Maine's reverting farmsteads.

Foggy Mountain's turkey hunts are in a region full of this prime turkey habitat, where it is common to get the chance to harvest multiple birds.

Rabbit Hunts

2021 Rabbit Season:

One to 5-Day Hunts December 1st thru March 31st Youth Hunters Half Price

Our action-packed Rabbit (Snowshoe Hare) hunts start at 8 AM when we head to prime rabbit cover and then turn our well-trained beagles loose. We put you in a prime crossing location while the beagles circle the rabbit back toward you.

We enjoy a break from all the action at noon for a tailgate lunch, then head back into the thicket for more afternoon action.

Weapon of choice is a shotgun (410, 20, 12, & 16) so this hunt lets everyone take aim at a rabbit in front of our beagles regardless of age or shooting ability.
